Aligned support and accountability at the state, regional and local level.



State Level

Governor appoints State
Superintendent & State Board
President

State Superintendent accepts responsibility for and reports on state's progress; directs MDE

MDE becomes a world leader in supporting improvement by sharing model curricula, best practices, research, professional development, etc.

MDE approves local district/PSA Student Achievement & Investment Plans

Regional Level

ISD/RESA structure reviewed and redesigned as necessary for equity and capacity

All ISDs offer a prescribed menu of "economy of scale" services to constituent districts including instructional, administrative, and other supports for districts

ISD/RESAs become first line of supportive guidance and intervention for local districts/PSAs

ISD/RESAs must be accredited

Local District/PSA Level

Local districts/PSAs must submit a Student Achievement and Investment Plan to MDE for approval citing goals and methods for achieving those goals.

Local districts/PSAs must report to their communities on their progress on meeting the goals in the Plan

Local districts/PSAs will accept supportive guidance and intervention from ISD/RESAs and MDE
